WHAT TO DO IF YOUR CAR GETS STOLEN

- Report it to the Police. Phone 105 or fill in the form on the NZ Police website. The Police advise that you check your car hasn't been borrowed, towed, or moved first.
- Report it to CarJam, a website for checking vehicles for sale and if they're stolen https://www.carjam.co.nz/
- If insured, tell your insurance company.
- If your car was stolen from a monitored parking area, tell the parking company.
- Tell your friends on social media so they can keep an eye out.
- Be wary about scams on social media that offer to locate your car.

John Fox: A Local Hero of Budget Cooking

Amid the rising cost of living, the need for affordable and nutritious meal options has never been greater. The good news is help is at hand. A free e-recipe book, "Saver Flavour", offers more than 45 recipes that cost less than \$5 per serve. The book has been created by celebrated cook, Nadia Lim, in conjunction with none other than our very own TikTok influencer The Contraversial Kiwi, John Fox. John is a true local hero with a remarkable journey that's taken him from the firefighting world of Wellington to Torbay and TikTok stardom.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU LIVED LOCALLY?

I moved up from Wellington eight years ago to live with my new partner Liz. Combined we have four children. I have a 28-year-old and a 25-year-old, and living with us is Liz's 18-year-old son, and Liz and I have a lively four-year-old. Plus, we have another 18-year-old boarding with us.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO GET INTO COOKING?

I was a firefighter in Wellington for 20 years until an injury changed my path. During night shifts, we took turns doing the cooking, and I ended up being the designated chef. That's where I gained experience in cooking for four big burly guys on a budget. During my time as a firefighter, I saw a lot of poverty and the challenging conditions people live in. With the recent rise in the cost of living, I became frustrated seeing the government turning a blind eye to what it was doing to people. I just wanted to help and do my bit.

WE HEAR YOU'VE MADE QUITE AN IMPACT ON TIKTOK?

I initially had TikTok for fun, but when I saw the effects of the cost-of-living crisis on people. I thought, "There's gotta be a better way to educate people," and I had the platform to do it. I've always enjoyed cooking, and I enjoy experimenting with new things and challenging myself to create affordable meals. So I started filming how to cook large meals on a budget. I recently made a potato and chicken recipe for just \$21, and it's gotten 11,000 views so far.

I've now got 43,000 followers, mostly from New Zealand, but also scattered across Australia, the US, and other places. I've had many suppliers approach me to promote their products, but 9 out of 10 times I turn them down because I need to believe in the product. I've tried *Bargain Box*, and I really liked the product so when *Bargain Box* contacted me about Nadia's recipe book idea and they said it was going to be free to download, I was all in.

CAN YOU TELL US MORE ABOUT THE SAVER FLAVOUR?

It's all about giving and helping people get through tough times. All the main meal recipes in it contain at least one to three servings of vegetables and should cost no more than \$5 per serve to re-create at home. There's also lots of practical tips on how to reduce the cost of your weekly food shop.

HOW DO YOU BALANCE FILMING TIKTOK POSTS WITH A FULL-TIME JOB?

It's not easy. We create the posts on weekends with Liz doing the filming, media, and marketing. Both Liz and her sister have expertise in health and nutrition. Liz was a charge nurse

at Starship Hospital for 20 years until we had our 4-year-old and my 25-year-old daughter Kaylor also lives in Torbay and is studying to be a dental hygienist. So, trying to remain healthy runs in the family.

FINALLY, ARE YOU ENJOYING LIVING IN TORBAY?

I wasn't that keen on living in Auckland, but I absolutely love it! Torbay is a tight little community. My stepson, Beau, works at Euro Patisserie and he just won his first pie award. The beaches are beautiful and I'm into my fishing when I get time.

What/Where to Recycle

Hello Pumpkins!

Weekly I see landfill bags filled with recyclable items. These items will go to a landfill to be entombed for many lifetimes. Not only does this waste resources, but it also fills the land with items that could have been recycled.

Properly recycling these items is the easiest (and free) way to reduce outgoing waste into landfills.

Thankfully In Auckland, we can recycle so much of what we use in the home.

So, what can currently go in your Recycling Bin in Auckland?

- Glass bottles and jars
- Paper and cardboard packaging
- Egg cartons
- Tin, steel and aluminium cans, including empty aerosols
- Plastic bottles from your kitchen, bathroom, and laundry

- Clear plastic food containers
- Pizza boxes (remove any leftover food but grease is fine)
- Newspapers, magazines (including glossy), advertising mail and envelopes
- Aluminium foil. Save enough up to scrunch into a fist-sized ball and pop into your bin.
- Milk and juice cartons, including Tetra Pak® cartons.

OTHER LOCAL RECYCLING DROP-OFF **POINTS:**

Used garden pots: Drop your plant pots for recycling at Kings Plant Barn, Bunnings and Mitre 10.

Soft plastics: Can be dropped off at Countdown Browns Bay, New World Long Bay and inside Albany Mall (next to New World and Espresso Cafe).

Used Batteries: Take your used batteries to Bunnings in Silverdale.

Polystyrene: Can be taken to Mitre 10 Albany to the white bins inside the landscaping area (past the trade counter).

Have you noticed a build-up of mould on the inside of your windows? Mould can trigger allergic reactions and aggravate respiratory conditions. Mould can also damage window frames, sills, and glass over time, leading to structural issues, water leakage, and increased energy costs. Plus, it gives off an unpleasant musty, damp smell.

Removing mould from windows reduces the risk of exposure to harmful spores, reduces the spread of mould to other areas of the home, and cleaning it off can help to maximize natural light intake. But who likes washing windows?

One tool I tried has made window washing easier and less boring. The handheld, cordless, *Karcher KV 4 Vibrating Window Washer* looks a bit like an orbital sander. It comes with washable wiping pads that attach with velcro. You can fill the water reservoir

with soapy or plain water and as you move the machine over the glass you press the squirt button as needed.

The gentle vibrating function helps dislodge the mould and grime, saving you some scrubbing. I still used antibacterial spray, a cloth and an old toothbrush for the edges, corners, and any tough bits. But overall, it made window washing feel a lot more satisfying.

The window washer costs about \$140 (from Mitre 10) but it's rechargeable, made of sturdy materials that will last and it should help you stay healthier for several winters to come – as long as you use it.

November in the Garden

It's the last month of spring and time to get your summer veggies in now! The soil is warming up and you can direct sow most crops straight into your garden beds. However, the advantage of tray sowing is that you can more easily maintain an even moisture for your seedlings and prevent them from drying out.

TIME TO SOW: Cucumber, zucchini, parsley, pumpkin, beetroot, carrot, melon, corn, basil, dill, coriander, climbing beans and dwarf beans. For flowers, sow cosmos, calendula, borage, cornflower, marigolds, sunflowers, zinnias and phacelia.

TIME TO TRANSPLANT: Capsicum, chilli, aubergine and tomatoes.

GROWING POTATOES IN POTS: Growing your potatoes in a large container or pot could be a good option if you don't have a lot of space. You can also use a bucket or a sack, just make sure to make holes for drainage before planting.

Start by filling the bottom of the container with a 10cm thick layer of soil. Simply key your sprouted potatoes on the soil 20 cm apart and cover with soil. As your potatoes start growing keep topping up with soil taking care not to cover the leaves. Just put the soil around the plants. This er courages tubers developing along the stems underground. And one of the bonuses of growing them this way is that when they are ready you can simply tip the pot out to pick your potatoes.

MULCH MULCH: With a possible dry summer on the horizon don't forget to mulch mulch mulch! Mulching could make a world of difference to your garden. The mulch layer protects the soil from the hot summer sun and locks in the moisture. Use pea straw, aged sawdust or, for the cheapest and easiest option, use grass clippings and any green waste that you can find in the garden by simply lay it on the soil around your plants.

THINNING YOUR SEEDLINGS

If you planted some seedlings last month, it should be time to thin them out. At about 4 weeks growth you should be seeing the second set of leaves unfurling. Now is the time to remove the thin/straggly looking seedlings and keep the healthier ones. Thinning can also be done to ensure correct plant spacing.

When the plant has 4 sets of true leaves you can transplant it out into a bigger container, pot, or into your garden bed. Remember to water and feed with liquid fertiliser when needed. Seaweed tonic or diluted worm juice can be a great option.



How to Fish using a Setline from a Boat



By Nathan Pont

A setline from a boat consists of two floats, two anchors, a few hundred metres of mainline with chimps around a wheel or handline, up to 25 hooks (this is the maximum number of hooks allowed, larger ones to reduce by catch of undersized fish) on a leader which have clips to attach it to the mainline, and a trace holder.

I have found it works best if two people work together to put a setline out, but it also can be done by one person following these steps:

Step 1: Work out where the setline is going to be released. Critical things to consider: a sandy bottom, avoiding getting in the way of other boats, and reviewing your fishfinder to see if there is any fish sign.

Step 2: Bait all 25 hooks. I recommend using mullet, kahawai, or tuna as they stay on the hook longer. Remove one trace at a time then reattach it to the trace holder.

Step 3: Attach the first float to the end of the mainline. This should then be dropped into the ocean while the boat is drifting away.

Step 4: Once the mainline is out around 30–40m, there will be a lop in the mainline. The first anchor should be attached

to this. Once it is attached the anchor should be released into the water.

Step 5: Once the anchor gets to the bottom there starts being crimps on the mainline. The baited hooks can now be clipped on. I recommend going every 2 crimps as it spaces out the

Step 6: Once the hooks are on and more line is released there will be a second lop to attach the second anchor to. Repeat Step 4.

Step 7: The line will then come to an end. Attach the last float.

Step 8: Mark the spot on your GPS or use landmarks so you can identify the floats.

Step 9: I typically give the setline 30 minutes. Doing this gives fish long enough to eat the baits but not too long that sharks become interested and under-size fish can be released.

It's nearly BBQ weather. One of the most versatile BBQ's, great for beginners is the Charcoal Kettle BBQ. The Kettle, named after its spherical shape, was started by Weber in 1951. It consists of a lid, cooking grate, charcoal grate, lower chamber, upper and lower venting system, and legs. Some models have a pan to catch the ash.

It's good for learning the different BBQ cooking methods, such as direct cooking (of steaks, sausages, lamb chops); indirect cooking (for ribs, whole chicken, and roasts); and low-and-slow cooking and smoking (for example for cooking fish, large bone-in meats and brisket).

CHOOSING YOUR FUEL

Whether you use charcoal briquettes or lump charcoal depends on the type of cooking you are doing. Lump charcoal typically lights quicker and burns hotter, but it also burns faster. Lump charcoal is best for direct cooking when you want the meat to cook faster. Charcoal briquettes are good for indirect cooking and low-and-slow cooking as they burn

at a lower temperature and last longer. I now only use briquettes and if I am doing direct cooking, I use more briquettes or get more flame running on them.

Whilst I've focused on Weber, there are many different types of BBQs on sale, and they range in price. Feel free to email questions me via magazine@torbay.co.nz if you want advice on which sort to buy.

Spring in the Natural Environment

Last month our community was blessed by a large pod of terehu (bottlenose dolphins) which stayed in the area. It was amazing to see them from the Centre a couple of times a day for a few days in a row. Considering why leads us to understand a bit more about the complex social structures of delphinids. When pregnant and/or with newborns they form "nursery pods". These nursery pods typically stay closer to shore meaning they can birth and nurse in calmer waters rather than battling the elements further offshore. These activities have high energy demands and as their food sources move closer to shore as the weather warms, being closer to shore means they can fuel themselves.

Looking at our feet in rock pools we can find similar reproduction going in at this time with nudibranchs starting to lay eggs. If you see delicate ribbon spirals in the rock pools, these are likely nudibranch eggs. If you look closely, you can see the individual eggs in the ribbon. The colour of





the eggs often reflects the type of eggs. So, the yellow-coloured spirals are probably laid by a lemon nudibranch (Dendrodoris citrina).


