Torbay Pharmacy: Nerve Pain - My Natural Prescription

Nerve pain is difficult to treat with conventional pain killers. Paracetamol and anti-inflammatories like Nurofen or Voltaren don't seem to reduce nerve pain. Even serious opioid pain killers like codeine, tramadol and morphine do not provide relief. For this reason, doctors will often try anti-depressant medicines like amitriptyline, or anti-epiletics such as gabapentin. While these medicines can be helpful, they have side effects that might be problematic. So what else can you do?



Lipoic Acid:

Lipoic acid can be very helpful to reduce nerve pain. I have seen

good results quite quickly in patients in my clinic with conditions like quadriplegia, Multiple Sclerosis, Fibromyalgia and diabetes. Lipoic acid is part of the B-vitamin family. It is commonly prescribed by doctors in Germany for nerve pain, but in NZ it is not well known. It is quite safe to take in dosages from 200mg up to 600mg/day and can be purchased without a prescription.

B-Vitamins:

The B-vitamins are essential for nerve function, especially vitamin B12. I will always recommend people who get Shingles take high doses of vitamin B12 to protect their nerves. This is important because nerve pain after a shingles infection can be very debilitating.

Magnesium:

Magnesium has been shown to be helpful in alleviating nerve pain in some patients. Hardly surprising when you consider magnesium is essential for the functioning of the brain. As an aside, some studies have shown that paracetamol is far more effective for reducing headaches when it is given with magnesium.

Capsaicin:

Capsaicin gels help to relieve nerve pain when those nerves are close to the skin surface. It does tend to burn for the first few applications, but if you can get past this burning you will get some good relief.

Mindfulness:

I attended a pain lecture recently where it was suggested that pain can be a sign from the brain that something needs to change in your life rather than a sign that there is damage in your body. Now you may think that I'm getting a bit "woo-woo" here, but there is now good science to back up the link between the brain and the body. If you need more convincing, I suggest you watch the movie "The Connection" by Shannon Harvey. It

explains the mind-body connection very well.

My prescription for nerve pain is lipoic acid, magnesium, a B-complex combined with meditation, yoga and slow breathing techniques.

Ingredients

1 large head cauliflower cut into bitesize florets about 7-8 cups

3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1 teaspoon yellow curry powder * optional - see notes

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

Roasted

Cauliflower is plentiful at present. It can be a very boring vegetable, with little taste. Recent Masterchef episodes convinced me that the way to go is roasting.

Instructions

Preheat oven to 220°C. Line a baking sheet with foil and lightly spray with cooking spray.

Add cauliflower florets and drizzle with olive oil. Sprinkle with seasonings and toss until evenly coated. Spread cauliflower out in an even layer so the florets aren't touching.

Bake at 220°C for 25-30 minutes OR until cauliflower are fork tender and the edges are slightly charred.

Best served immediately.

Cauliflower will take any flavouring so make it Indian, Thai, Mexican or Italian by using herbs and spices from those cuisines.

Author Talk with Stephen Johnson


Wednesday 18 November 10:00am – 11:30am Free event.

Passionate members of the community recognized the need to have the area protected so that future generations could see a "typical slice of the Hauraki Gulf" when they came to

visit. This was closely tied into the view that a marine reserve could be a valuable educational resource for those that visited us at MERC, and boy are we lucky to have that protection.

have to get wet, but it helps! Theres rockpools to explore and if you wait for a calm day with good visibility, at high tide there is some good snorkeling spots you might be able to spot some snapper.

AVOID 7 MISTAKES THAT COST YOU MONEY: Selling your House for a Better Price

Mistake #1 (September issue) : DIY Mishaps & Unconsented Works.

Mistake #2: (October Issue): Improvements Resulting in Defective Titles for Crosslease or Unit Properties.

Mistake #3: Going all out for colour. While most of us like a house that shows off your personality... when we come to visit... we've found that the current majority of buyers, hunting homes for themselves, are looking for something that they can move into straight away, ready to live in. We call this a 'turnkey' home. It can be a huge mistake to paint out the home in your favourite colours, before going on the market, and risk buyers struggling to match their furniture

to your home décor. If buyers can't see themselves living there, as is, your home may stay exactly that - "YOUR home". Even pale neutrals in yellow, brown or "Spanish" shades can make a home feel dated.

DON'T: Head to the paint shop with the idea of spending money on a 'Brave New Colour Scheme' to wow like-minded purchasers. They may be few and far between. Another mistake is to renew all the curtains in the home with lovely dark charcoal premade curtains. They may look great at night, but can darken small rooms, or block the light during the day especially if the curtain track doesn't extend beyond the window.

DO: Check out building company show-homes for

colour trends. They are designed to appeal to the majority - for good reason.

KEY POINTS: 1. Aim for light & bright. Shades of white rarely disappoint and help the home feel fresher & more spacious to buyers.

2. It's easier to sell a home with no curtains at all, than to show rooms with the light partially occluded, or swallowed up in dark colours.

Tater shortages have made gardening challenging, and will continue throughout summer. Many of us will be placing a plastic basin in the sink or handbasin, to collect and re-use water from indoor taps. A bucket on the bench will also save any unfinished drinks, vase or rinse water. Here our members share how they are conserving and capturing water and retaining moisture in the soil.

"This will work if water from your washing machine flows out of an open pipe before going

underground. Buy a short length of pipe which fits snugly into the outlet pipe. Attach about one metre of flexible pipe to this. At the start of the second rinse, pause the machine. Fit your new outlet over the pipe and direct the water into buckets. I get six large buckets and use it to water in the evening. Sometimes I add a little liquid fertiliser"

Mulching is important. "I use everything that will keep soil moist. Grass, tender weeds, soft prunings, leaves, sawdust, and newspaper covered by weeds."

rainwater tank, but if there is no rain it doesn't get replenished. I use grass clippings and mulch from our mulching machine. When planting out new plants I use home-made compost that retains

moisture better than anything else."

"One of my gutters overflows in heavy rain so I have big buckets there ready to catch it all. I put a bucket with strong handle and pouring spout into the shower to catch the 'warming up' water" Depending on your shower, this



can yield up to a bucket to fill watering cans.

"I put containers around the place to catch any rainwater. I also collect pine needles and use compost for mulching. It takes only a few seconds to read water care rules and avoid a fine."

We hope that these ideas will be useful in the coming season and that your gardens will bloom and flourish.



In the garden in November

New season roses are available. AllI rose bushes and climbers need fertilizing and spraying to prevent black spot.

Lightly trim flowering shrubs to tidy them up for summer.

Plant summer flowering annuals such as Cosmos, Lobelia, Gazanias,

Aoteoroa Memories

Aster, Dahlia, Celosia, Larkspur, Sunflower, Marigold, Petunias, and Phlox.

Continue to plant plant vegetable seedlings. Stagger plantings for a longer harvest including Capsicum, Carrots, Parsnips, Corn, Cucumber, Kumara, Pumpkin, Silverbeet, Tomatoes and Zucchini.

Plant Rhubarb and Passionfruit and fertilise with sheep pellets. Dwarf citrus can be established in pots with frequent watering and feeding.

For a good supply of summer herbs continue planting Basil, Oregano and Thyme. Plant Parsley, Rocket and Coriander in part shade as this will slow down bolting to seed.

Social housing is a big need in Auckland, with a whopping 6,617 Aucklanders currently on the waiting list for a home.

Local organisation Bays Community Housing Trust (BCHT) is committed to solving this. In October, they completed 5 brand new homes in Long Bay, adding to their existing portfolio of 34 homes across the North Shore. The new Long Bay homes are part of a community setting named Te Whare Manawa Ora – 'Whare' meaning House, 'Manawa' meaning Heart, and 'Ora' meaning Wellbeing. The name was chosen in consultation with Kaumatua's from Ngati Paoa and Ngati Whanaunga.

The houses are a new model of what community looks like, says BCHT General Manager John Tiy. They have been intentionally designed to provide homes for people who need them, and to be close to community groups, amenities, and each other.

"Social inclusion - feeling like we're part of a community - is one of the biggest contributors to a person's wellbeing" says Tiy. "This means social housing is much, much more than just providing a roof over someone's head – it's about ensuring people feel connected to their own community"

Tiy says there is a huge range of reasons why some people need help finding a place to live, and that COVID has exacerbated this. "There are a multitude of factors, including age, family situation, financial situation". The Trust is committed to helping their tenants feel empowered and self-sufficient (regardless of situation), and employs a team of community coordinators to help achieve this.



ast month we wrote about the
Inaming of Ashley Avenue. The
black and white photo was the corner
of Ashley and Glenvar Roads in 1950.
The coloured photo was the north
end of Ashley Ave. in 2006. Beside
that building was 'Podgora' 68 Ashley
Ave. If you google it you will find it is very near to Glenvar
Ridge Road, so this tells you how far the original road went.
Some origins of other names in Torbay. - 'Kura is the Maori
name for school. Other Maori names include Orewa which



could be a shortened form of Rewarewa, the tree that grew in this area. Awaruku – awa means river and ruku to sink or dive. Tainui is the name of the Maori canoe that stayed at Waiake for a few years The name was given by the captain of the Tainui.' – meaning 'bubbling waters.' - Could be shortened from Waiake ake ake - waters forever. According to some historians he also named paths called 'ara motu iti' – the path to the small island, and 'Ara Oneroa' –the road to Long Bay.

Early settlers have been remembered in the names such as Long, Vaughan, Gray and Auld. In 1920 members of the Young family subdivided land in Waiake and chose Biblical names including Bethel and Hebron. Many streets have been named after yachts including Fidelis, Freya, Gerontius and Infidel. One of the photos shows 'McGowans Beach, with their house on the hill – 1908. The other - enjoying summer at the Waiake 1997.

Your Smart Gu

Te have smart fridges, smart washing machines, smart phones, smart watches and it seems smart everything these days. Everyone also has a smart gut. We know that the gut contains a very complex network of neurons or nerves, which has been called the second brain. The gut also contains 70% of the immune system. IMMUNISE AGAINST HPV (HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS) CANCERS

The good news is that immunisation against the 9 HPV types that cause the majority of HPV-related cancers is FREE for males and females up to 26 years of age. Research shows that the vaccine is more effective when given to younger people, which is why those under 14 years of age only require two doses, where older teenagers require three doses.

All doses are required to ensure maximum protection.

The HPV vaccine is very similar in nature to a number of other vaccines that have proven themselves to give long-lasting protection and the same is expected of the HPV vaccine.

Personal viewpoints of two of your Hibiscus & Bays Local Board Members

Grants awarded for local groups

Grants have recently been awarded by the Hibiscus and Bays Local Board. A range of fantastic community groups were recipients, including some Torbay groups:

Sir Peter Blake Marine Education and Recreation Centre – Towards the costs of a programme associated with Seaweek.

Torbay Business Association – Towards costs for a range of events for the community.

Long Bay Baptist Church – Towards two youth workers on-site at Long Bay College for 24 hours a week (Whare Rangatahi youth-work).

Awatuna Sea Scouts – Towards the purchase of water safety equipment.

Mountains to Sea Conservation Trust – Towards costs to run paddle and snorkel events (Experiencing Marine Reserves)

Long Bay Okura Great Park Society – Towards the cost of two community open days and a snorkelling day.

Friends of Okura Bush – Towards traps, a GPS camera, and installation of a water catchment system.

Advocating for a recycling centre

We've been working closely with other North Shore Local Boards to provide strong advocacy to Council on the need for a community recycling centre (CRC) on the North Shore.

Currently, there are 9 CRCs in Auckland with 3 more opening soon. North Shore Local Boards have poor access to these CRCs (the nearest being an over half-hour trip away).

Council has just refreshed its strategy for the Resource Recovery Network. We wrote our Board's feedback on the strategy and have directed staff to investigate locations for a fit-for-purpose recycling centre to service in a central location easily accessed by East Coast Bays and North Shore residents.

Last financial year the 9 regional CRCs diverted over 5,200 tonnes of waste from landfill to reuse and recycling and saved 823,761 kg CO2-e (carbon dioxide equivalents) by diverting green waste and timber. We believe Bays residents would relish the opportunity and challenge to do their bit and recycle and reduce further waste.

Meet the Torbay Plunket Committee

The Torbay Plunket Committee meet the first Tuesday evening of each month and is currently made up of six local Mums.

We are volunteers who offer our time, skills and knowledge to help organise and run fundraising events which ensure Torbay Plunket can continue to help support the local community – whether it be providing better facilities at the Torbay Plunket Clinic or helping to fund the Meals For Families programme for all new parents in the area.

Carlette, our Committee Administrator, runs the meetings and takes the meeting minutes. Carlette has a background in marketing and is currently full time Mum to three young children.

Amber, our Social Media whizz, keeps our community up to date with regular posts on our Facebook page. Amber is a

teacher, currently working part time and is Mum to two young children.

Natalie, our Meals For Families Coordinator who contacts all new parents and organizes frozen meals to be delivered to them. Natalie works part time at North Shore Hospital and has two young children.

Bex, our Committee All-rounder and chief raffle seller is a fulltime primary school teacher with a one year old.

We also have two new recruits to the committee – Amanda and Jessica, which we are very excited to get to know better – so welcome to the team!

The Committee is overseen and supported by our regional Plunket Community Support Coordinator, Katrina (also a Torbay mum of five), who is a valuable source of information and shares with us what other committees are doing around Auckland. Our amazing Plunket Nurse, Michele, also attends and is always on hand to help out at our fundraising events.

The committee meetings are pretty informal and every member can choose to do as little or as much as they want. Once all agenda items have been discussed, we invariably end up having a chat and a bit of a catch up. We are a very easy-going bunch and would welcome some fresh faces to join our team and support Plunket in the local Torbay community.

Cast Coast Bays
Library in Browns Bay have recently celebrated 50 years of serving our local community. A Photographic Exhibition of heritage images marked the occasion.

In the very early days of Browns Bay a small lending library operated out of the General Store on Clyde Road near to where Deep Creek Brews & Eats is today. It wasn't until 1970 that a purpose built Keith Hay building opened as a public library on the current

site in Bute Road. It held a relatively small stock but offered readers the opportunity to access a larger collection through an



agreement with the Takapuna City Council.

The present library was opened in 1982 and the design by Dodd Patterson **Architects** won the prestigious **New Zealand** Institute

of Architects

National Award. As membership grew the library was extended in 1993, then the Ethel Baxter Magazine Room was added in 1999 thanks to a bequest left by an altruistic patron Miss Ethel Baxter. A major refurbishment took place in 2002 which changed the original Bute Road entrance of the building to create an entrance on the Village Green, a move which helped to reduce congestion on Bute Road. In 2010 a generous donation by the Strinati family enabled the building of the library reading courtyard.

Library services have also changed

over the years in response to the needs of the community. Nowadays the library is more than just books, with children's programmes, discussion groups, literacy groups, craft groups, free public internet computers, holiday programmes, free wifi, talks and events, as well as many online and eResources. Book a Librarian services are free and provide customers with the undivided attention of a librarian for an hour to help with accessing eResources, library websites, CV help, Family History and basic computer and website issues. The library has also been pro-actively contacting our older and health-compromised customers who are housebound due to vulnerability to Covid. Auckland Libraries mobile and access teams are making home deliveries to these customers. We look forward to the next 50 years!!

Friends of Gerontius Reserve was also a successful applicant to the 2020 Restore Hibiscus & Bays Volunteer Initiatives Programme, which is funded through an Auckland Council Regional Environment and Natural Heritage grant. The group has already used the funds to engage professional ecocontractors to carry out full control of environmental weeds that are too difficult for volunteers to tackle, including large



areas of wild ginger and some pampas. The plan is to now prepare and maintain the area for community planting next winter.




